IRARC at Cocoa Beach for JRDF

The Indian River Amateur Radio Club completed its second public affairs event for 2013 by providing support to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) walk on Cocoa Beach on April 6, 2013. The event start began at Lori Wilson park and walkers moved to the beach and proceeded north to the turn around point at Shepard Park. The event began under clear cool skies but as the morning wore on, temperatures rose to

the mid 70s - just a great time for a beach walk. Gene, W4JMX acted as the special event shadow while Steve, N4UTQ performed net control duties. The Cocoa Beach front presented a special challenge since the club's 145.37 MHz repeater coverage is spotty on the beach for operators using regular size HT antennas. The event was conducted on 147.42 MHz, our normal simplex frequency used after the Wednesday night ARES net. To facilitate communications from Shepard Park, a J-pole antenna was hoisted 20 feet above the beach terrain. The J-pole performance was excellent allowing Stan, KJ4NUV and John N3RCV to act as relays for the mid point walker team; Dave K4UZM, Kevin KK4DNI and Dave KU0R. Jane, KI4ZYQ provided back up to the mid point station. At press time, the local JDRF association raised approximately \$100,000 in contributions with the final goal of \$150K within sight after the beach walk pledges were tallied. Thanks to all who supported JDRF!


Meet Us On the Following...
