After the SKYWARN presentation, various reports were given. Wayne, K0DKT noted the purchase of the D-STAR ICOM ID880 UHF/ VHF radio with a programming cable. Bob, N4VO reported all repeaters are functional and the 145.37 MHz repeater now has battery backup capability due to the purchase and installation of an Optima AGM battery at the repeater site. Stan, KJ4NUV gave a short outbrief of the April SET results. Overall the exercise was successful with a significant finding of desense on the 147.42 MHz simplex frequency observed at the Brevard Central Operating Location. The ARES group will follow up on the desense issue. Terry, AF7W and Mike, K4RVR asked the club to support the April BEARS Hamfest. Greg, AB4GO discussed the upcoming Field Day event and asked the membership where we should hold the event. We still need a FD chairman to organize the event. So far we plan to run a two station suite with a Get On The Air (GOTA) station at the Red Cross facility. We will need a list of operators to operate in two-person teams for two hour shifts. Greg brought the meeting to a close asking the membership to supply ideas for future meeting presentations. Mike, K4RVR won the 50/50 prize of \$18 - he also won last month!

Club Meeting Presentation: SKYWARN Training

Scott Spratt, KT4PD, National Weather Service (NWS) Warning Coordination Meteorologist presented the SKYWARN Basic Training Class at the April IRARC meeting. Scott's presentation focused on why trained volunteers are requested to assist in reporting significant weather events, radar system capabilities and limitations, the thunderstorm life cycle and what events require notification back to the NWS. Although we tend to focus in hurricanes, Scott presented time line of severe thunderstorm/ tornado events in Central Florida and noted everyone should own a weather radio with alert capability. SKYWARN volunteers are requested to use the website tools located at www.weather. gov/melbourne to gain an awareness of forecasted events in our local area.
