# E-Bay and Ham Radio (How to Bid and Win Deals)

You first have to register with ebay before you can bid on anything and that means setting up a paypal account. Things that you buy with PayPal will show up in on a credit card you use when you set up the account. The key to getting good deals is to bid a price that you feel pretty certain that this would be a good price, and **bid only once.** Say for instance we are bidding on a 3KW tuner and the current bid is \$200. You think that a new 3KW tuner goes for about \$370, so you bid \$250 and forget you ever bid on it. Later you get an email to notify that you did not win and just out of curiosity you find out that it sold for \$251. Just don't worry about it I see people get up in the bidding/winning fever and they end up paying stupid money for stuff. Another thing you need to keep in mind is that sometimes you buy stuff that's broke. When you buy broke stuff you can almost always go back and look at the listing and see a clue that you missed that indicated that the thing you bought might not work as its supposed to, so you need look at

the exact verbiage in the ad and how the seller is rated. Each time you buy something on ebay you should rate your transaction and if anybody has ever bought something and not been completely satisfied their rating will be something less than 100%. Something else you should be aware of is that sellers look at bidders too. If you don't have a track record of buying things and then following through and paying for them, your bid might be canceled by the seller. People that sell things on ebay put their item up for a certain time period after which the item sells for whatever the highest bid is. Most bidders that really want an item will wait until the last few seconds to bid what they <u>are really willing to pay. I like to</u> mess that up by placing my max bid whenever I see the item. Lets sav we bid on a mint Ameritron AL-80 four days from the end of the auction. We know these amps go for \$1200 new and the current bid is \$300, so we bid \$600, which would be a steal. What the bid is going show is \$350, and should nobody else bid higher, that's

what you get that amp for! When somebody sees that amp for \$350 they bid \$400 and the bid advances to \$410 automatically since you bid \$600. Sometimes sellers don't list their stuff correctly and it doesn't show up in the search that the masses are typically using so the bids aren't rolling in. So sometimes your search terms can help if you are in the market for something specific. For instance if you are looking for a good deal on a hand held you might use a search term like 'Yaesu VHF' and you might find a straggler listed as 'Walki Talki'. **So bid but be** sensible and remember you are taking a gamble on anything you buy on ebay. Again look very carefully at the text the seller uses, and only buy stuff that you can do without. If you don't already own a nice HF radio, go and buy a new one. The only used piece of equipment that makes sense to buy used are HF amplifiers, but there again that's something no one really needs! 73s - Steve N4UTQ

UFO Activity Over Merritt Island

NEUFO.org, a recognized UFO investigation group, reported a UFO sighting near the junction of State Route 3 and State Route 528 on Merritt Island, not far from the Kennedy Space Center, at approximately 2:30 PM on this date. Shortly after, a radio report indicated that a UFO was sighted in Orlando in the vicinity of the Anheuser-Busch outlet.

At 7:30PM, local scanner listeners heard a complaint from the Merritt Island Airport of an UFO flying erratically, again over the State Route 528 Beachline on Merritt Island. Responding investigators from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office noted at 8:07PM that the alleged UFO had apparently experienced a hard landing in the Aldi's parking lot, spilling approximately thirty empty Busch Ice cans onto private property.

After the on-site investigation, an FUI ticket was issued to the operator for flying under the influence of alcohol or some other debilitating liquid (purple) or drug.

Analysts, who choose not to be identified at this time, suspect that Merritt Island residents Mr. and Mrs. Steve Luchuk were taken for an unauthorized but merry joyride with an awkward return.



License of the pilot, acquired via the Freedom of Information Act, allegedly cited for an FUI during the UFO incident on Merritt Island on Friday. Please note that all accused are innocent until proven guilty, except we are reasonably certain that this is the guy.
